

Conformation title she will be the third Ernie champion this year. A repeat breeding of this wonderful, typey and outgoing litter is anticipated in the future.

In Memoriam: PERCY

October 17, 1988 - August 11, 2003

Known to all his friends as Percy, this fourteen-year-old miniature poodle had a busy career in a wide variety of canine activities. Percy retired in 2001 with over 30 titles, including obedience, agility, flyable, and field and versatility. Percy was the first miniature in North America to earn the Poodle Club of America Working Certificate, and ran as test dog in the CKC Working Certificate series on numerous occasions. Percy was also the first poodle (all varieties) to earn the Flyball Dog Master and Flyball Dog Master Excellent titles, finally retiring with over 16,000 points. A member of the Superdog Performance Team for five years Percy was a familiar figure at the Royal Horse Show in Toronto, and made appearances on TSN running the Modified Relay for International Teams and Superdogs. In 2000 he appeared on a National Geographic special based on the Westminster Dog Show demonstrating his hunting abilities. Recognized with versatility awards from Versatility in Poodles Inc., and the Poodle Club of Canada, this cheerful and intelligent companion has been a great joy and source of immense pride. I can only thank him for being such a great part of my life and introducing me to a whole world I could only have dreamed of.


In Europe, he is a multi BIS-2, SBIS-2, multiple Group winner and placer.

An open letter on changes to the Canadian Kennel Club standard of conformation from the Poodle Club of Canada sent by Mary Jane Weir

CLIP: b: English Saddle Clip c: Continental Clip

change: removal of the phrase is left in full coat.

old standard: The rest of the body is left in full coat but may be shaped to ensure overall balance.

new standard: The rest of the body may be shaped to ensure overall balance.

Reasons for the change: a: The addition of all three varieties of Poodle to the CKC field events has posed a problem for those exhibitors who wish to compete in both conformation and field. To maintain a poodle in "full coat" while training for field events is possible, but few have either the time or the desire to do so; consequently, an undesirable division between "field" and "show" may develop to the detriment of the Poodle breed. The Poodle Club of Canada wishes to encourage versatile Poodles, titled in more than one type of competition.

b: The growth and maintenance of a full "show" coat can be intimidating for novice exhibitors and those handicapped by age or other conditions. The Poodle Club of Canada wishes to provide an easier option,

which is acceptable in the show ring.

c: An over-emphasis on styling and presentation can obscure in the public's mind the very real working qualities of this breed.

The effect of the change:

The actual pattern of both the English Saddle Clip and the Continental Clip as described in the standard remains unchanged. However, all unshaved portions of the coat are proportionately shorter. The topknot is scissored in an unbroken line into the mane, allowing the dog an unrestricted field of vision. Ear fringes are shortened in proportion, as is the mane coat and pack in the English saddle or the mane and puffs in the Continental. So long as the prescribed pattern is maintained (and an obvious difference in length between mane and pack in the English Saddle), the overall length of coat is immaterial. The practice of blowing a curly coat straight for shaping is not mandated in the standard, and exhibitors may choose to present a curly coat in its natural state.

The impression of this shorter, working version of the two adult clips should be neat, tailored and should allow the dog to move easily among conformation ring, performance event and field trial with a minimum of fuss. A Poodle of quality in this working trim should receive equal consideration in the conformation

FEET change: addition of the sentence The front feet should turn out 10 degrees and the rear feet should turn neither in nor out.

old standard: The feet turn neither in nor out.

new standard: The front feet should turn out 10 degrees and the rear feet should turn neither in nor out.

Reason for change: This change addresses a common misunderstanding about the correct shape and placement of the front leg. The two long bones of the front leg (the radius and ulna) are so shaped that they rotate around one another during the stride. A paw, which turns out 10 degrees when the dog is standing, will rotate to point directly forward during the striking phase of a single tracking trot. The attempt to breed a dog whose feet point straight ahead when standing has led to distortions of the chest shape and incorrect placement of the forelimbs on the body.

Effect of the change:

The change should lead to a more natural stance in the show ring and improvements in front structure for the breed.

TAIL change: addition of may be docked.

old standard: Set on high, docked and carried up.

new standard: Set on high, carried up, and may be docked.

Reason for change: The prohibition of docking in a number of countries means that Poodles imported from those countries require a cosmetic operation before they can be shown, a procedure which many exporters and importers wish to avoid. The allowing of undocked tails in the conformation ring should remove any reluctance of foreign breeders to export to Canada over this issue. Canadian breeders may also wish to avoid cosmetic operations.

The effect of the change: The tail pom is elongated, having the shape of a bottlebrush rather than a ball. The tail is still carried up, with a sabre curve. A tight curt over the back is the extension of the faulty snap" tail.

CHOOSING A PERFORMANCE PUPPY

The following article was submitted by Lee Kozicki, who has competed in Obedience for many years. She has been in the Top 10 on many occasions including the last few years with "Smurf" Ch MOTCH Quillstone Casey Jones. Her new Miniature "Crunch" Can Am Ch Claydon Crunch A Munch CDX and he has shown great potential as well with High in Trials in both Open and Novice. Pictured below are 2 Tudorose puppies.



For breeders picking an obedience puppy can be tougher than picking there next best in show star for not only must you pick the right puppy but also match it with the right trainer. At seven weeks the puppy has a fully developed brain and has for the most part not learned responses to things in his world so it is thought to be the best time to make choices in a litter. Since most breeders spend a good deal of time with there puppies it is also helpful to have a tester help with grading the litter but this should only be a guide. A good deal of what makes a great show dog also go into making a great obedience dog Temperament and soundness are a must. A puppy that is shy or sight or sound sensitive will have to deal with this all his life as an obedience dog. Picking the puppy that prefers to play with people rather than puppies also helps as I believe there are people dogs and dogs dogs. In larger litters you will find puppies who want to be with you not the rest of the gang. Look to the ones that try for your attention rather than the ones playing happily with there litter mate. Play games with individual puppies one at a time and note responses. Puppies in a group get courage from each other but on there own show a more accurate picture of what they have to offer you. Many times breeders think a puppy is the boss of the litter or the most insecure in the litter and testing them on there own may prove you right or surprise you. Taking each puppy to an area it has not been before will give you a guide to how it handles new places by itself. Play with the puppy for a few minuets then walk away asking it to follow you. A puppy that follows along shows a willingness to team up with you One who wanders off to explore this new place may be brave and outgoing but will he be willing to become a team player. Try throwing a toy a few feet away does the puppy go for the toy great does he return to you without the toy also fine choosing to be with you is never bad. Returning to you with the toy also great. Taking the toy and heading off shows independent attitude not something to look for in a team sport. While there are no pass or fail in testing litters the test help pick out the best puppy for a particular trainer. If you have a person looking for his first obedience puppy who is very soft and quiet you would not pair this person with the tough alpha



puppy in the litter likewise a very demanding trainer would probably not pair well with the little softy in the litter. So as a breeder not only must you find the obedience prospect in the litter but also the right match for the puppy. Some litters may be wonderful others you may be hard pressed to fine one with that extra flair that just tells you this is a special puppy. Some eight years ago I temperament tested a litter of minis for a friend and told her there was a special puppy in the litter that should go to an obedience home. Two weeks later he did go to an obedience home MINE though I was not looking for my next dog at the time I new he would be a star. A best in show dog is a wonderful thing for a breeder BUT how about a multi high in trial dog breeders should be just as proud to have bred this. Hope this helps in your next selection bye for now Lee

Lisbeth called me tonight to let me know she was in Calgary this past weekend with her Poodle Alias Elijah CDX (Eli). They were competing in a Draft Dog Trial. Unfortunately Lisbeth was worried about not touching certain trees and stumps on the track (informed they could not touch these items as part of the scenario for passing) that she did not get Eli's speed up for the steep hill. He just did not have enough pull to get his 40 pound load up the hill. Many competitors and the judges commented on what a good working team the two were. Lisbeth is thinking of heading to Victoria next year to try again. One Standard Poodle did pass their DD and it was Waterford Charles of Jamel CD (now) DD handled by Donella Scott-Congratulations

The problem with Drafting Tests is that same as Tracking tests. Only so many can be judged in a day and they are not a big draw. Lisbeth was saying for the drafting you have to get your entries in fast or the trial is full. This trial in Calgary had 14 DD dogs and 4 DDX competitors. The good thing about drafting is you need 3 judge's to give you a qualify for your title but all three are judging you at the same time.

Drafting makes for a long day at the competition but the folks are all friendly and have to be just as patient. I went to a drafting trial when I visited Cheryl Ingwersen in Ontario last year and was floored watching a huge Leonberger back up with the cart in a straight line with only verbal commands from their handler. Anybody who has seen a Leonberger can appreciate this. Tha carts look very similar to a cart used in horse racing and all loads have to be placed on by the handler. You are scored for this as well.

Poodle Club of Canada Directors Report For Alberta By Tanis Waldo/Teannas Poodles

This Report brings me to write about several issues that have come to my attention over the last couple of months Owner ID tattoo's vs. CKC registered Tattoo's

The True Story of a Poodle Almost Euthenised a CINDERELLA STORY

This article starts with a litter I bred 8 years ago; all of them were sold to pet homes with Spay/neuter and CKC non-breeding contracts... All of these Poodles went as 12 week old puppies to what I thought were Fantastic homes, however due to circumstances beyond my control the owners of a female from the litter returned her to me for some family issues & aggression in the dog... This dog will not be named nor will the prior owners to protect the interests of the individuals involved more so the dog. For that reason we will call the dog Misty (the name of our deceased German Shepard)...

Upon arrival of Misty I was informed she had not been spayed and had not come into season in all the time she had been in her previous home & there was aggression issues, with this in mind I proceeded to do every test that could possibly give us some answers as to why she was aggressive. After great discussions with my vet we proceeded to do Thyroid testing & a full blood chemistry Panel, when nothing showed up we continued to test for Addisons, kidney functions, hips, eyes & everything else genetic still nothing showed up, all testing was done at my expense... After 6 months of obedience training Misty was very happy in my home & still no signs of Aggression...

The family that had her previously wanted to have Misty back after their wolf/cross passed away. I did not in any way want to ship Misty back as I thought there was some underlying reason for Misty's aggression that I still had not uncovered but I could not see up to this point any aggression at all. After a long discussion with Registrations division of the CKC, I was told I did not own Misty and I would have NO choice but to send her back to the original owners. Against everything I believe in I shipped Misty back to the original owners. I lived the next couple of weeks with a grueling ache in my stomach worrying about Misty. Two weeks later there was a message on my answering machine that the dog was on its way back to me as she had bit someone again. These people shipped Misty back without knowing someone on the other end would be here to pick her up at the airport. The Previous owners were informed there would be no refund and no puppy replacement due to the situation and that she had no genetic health problems that would entitle them to a refund or replacement (as per our contract). I informed them the proper paperwork must be completed for CKC purposes being I had been through the CKC issue with them before and that is why Misty had to endure a second time in this home. The biggest problem here was that without CKC papers this dog is not considered Purebred; being a CKC member I cannot otherwise dispose/sell Misty. After several times sending addressed, STAMPED envelopes with the proper paperwork for CKC these owners would not sign the required papers. Now in a situation where Misty is living with us VERY happy, & no aggression, I believed it to be something that the dog did not like in her previous home causing her stress. I now had strong suspicions of misstreatment.

To my astonishment she came into season, obviously feeling more comfortable in our home than theirs & no registration Fully tested this dog could not be bred. After several more try's to get the required paperwork for CKC with no luck I had to Place Misty with no money exchanging hands as advised by CKC. By this time I have housed this dog for over 1.5 years and incurred more than \$1500.00 in veterinary expenses. Being informed By CKC registrations division I could not sell the dog as I would be selling a NON-purebred and that is against CKC rules & regulations. I placed Misty with a friend in Calgary and told her to go ahead and spay her after she settles in. I called daily to see how Misty was doing everything seemed fine. Several months passed Misty was booked to be spayed, at which time her new mom (not owner being her CKC paperwork is still not signed over) asked the vet to put an owner ID tattoo in her ear. The veterinarian placed the owner id Tattoo in the right ear so close to the CKC registered Tattoo that the CKC tattoo is barely legible, although still legible the owner id tattoo is the first to be seen when the dogs ear is checked for a tattoo.

Several months has passed still everything was fine until I got a call from the new mom saying she had learned to be an escape artist and had gone out the computer room window and was lost somewhere in Calgary... It was the August long weekend and the roads were busy I panicked... Some kind person had Found Misty running across the road and took her into the nearest Vet Clinic... The vet clinic had tried several times to locate an owner by the Owner id tattoo being it was the most evident in the ear. The clinic tried every avenue to find the owner via the owner id tattoo. With no

luck Misty was scheduled to be euthanised being the person that dropped her off at the clinic said they couldn't keep her if the owner could not be located. Just by luck a Vet Tech that worked in the clinic took a liking to Misty. We like to call her Misty's guardian angel. Stephanie (the vet tech) took Misty out for a pee break and was petting her in the parking lot when she flipped Misty's ear only to see the CKC registered tattoo along with the Owner Id Tattoo...

Immediately she went into the clinic and the CKC was contacted the dog was traced back to me the breeder, I knew upon contact exactly where the dog should have been... Meanwhile still trying to get a hold of Misty's new mom who by the way had been frantically looking for her since her disappearance the clinic contacted me, I tried to get hold of Misty's new mom with no luck. I jumped into my truck and went to get Misty, as she would be put to sleep if someone didn't claim her. Had she been dropped off at the SPCA could Misty have faced Euthanasia due to an Owner Id Tattoo or would the CKC tattoo have gotten her back to the safety of home?

The moral of this story:

CKC registered Tattoo's are registered with the only registering body for Purebred dogs in Canada... Owner id Tattoo's are only in the files of the Clinic that placed the tattoo in the dogs ear...No rime or reason is put into the owner ld Tattoo's other than the letters of the clinic & the number of the dog being tattooed often no year letter is placed with the Vet Tattoo's... With no central database for Owner ld Tattoo's there could be dismal results for Purebred Dogs and we have not even crested the idea of Microchips and the readers for the different types of Chips & not everyone has access to a Microchip scanner at the drop of a hat... I have always used a tattoo being it is a Quick and easy way for ANYONE to identify one of my dogs should they get lost, not everyone has a microchip reader on hand... Another thing that bothers me, WHY would a vet Tattoo a Purebred dog with an Owner ld tattoo in the same ear as the CKC Tattoo, let alone to the point that the owner tattoo makes it difficult to read the breeders CKC tattoo. This sinareo could happen to any purebred dog... Owner ld Tattoo's should be registered with a central registering body... Now to make matters worse lets add the Purebred Dog Population to the Non- purebred population that are also Owner ld Tattooed and see if the system adopted by almost every vet clinic in Canada works...

I learned from this experience that my contracts will insist that the CKC tattoo be the only tattoo on my puppies preferably no owner id tattoos... If an owner chooses, against my wishes for the owner ld tattoo it be placed in the left ear opposite of the CKC tattoo, being I always tattoo my puppies in the right ear... Also if an owner is going to the extent of an owner ID tattoo they also re-touch the Breeder CKC tattoo to make sure they can be read by anyone at anytime...

All breeders should consider having owners with Owner id tattoo's record them with you as a breeder, or CKC, PCC & SPCA... Veterinarians should have some type of National Database that all owner id tattoos can be recorded. We can make a difference...

The Canadian Veterinary Association may be able to give me some insight as to how to initiate this type of National Database for Owner id Tattoo's...

Poodle Club of Canada has a record of Breeder Tattoo combinations for all members that are actively breeding. Please make sure that your Tattoo combination is included in PCC Records as well as registered with the SPCA in your Area. To have your Tattoo combination recorded with PCC it can be sent to:

First Canadian Poodle Specialty-submitted by Susan Fraser

The first Poodle Specialty was held at the Casa Loma in Toronto on a cold day in March, 1958. I remember being very impressed with the huge marble ball room where the show was held. Everything possible was done to make it a very special occasion. But, oh dear me, it's hard to remember the dogs and the people! So many (all the dogs of course) have gone, and it's hard to recreate the excitement of going to the very first poodle specialty held in Canada to be judged by Anne Hone Rogers, a top American handler of top poodles, as well as a breeder of them in her own right. There were 59 dogs present, 9 toys, 38 miniatures(including five specials) and 12 standards. At that time miniatures were the best variety, and in the open dog class there were two American BIS champions, so we did not feel very confident that our Canadian Champion Poodhall Gus could win the breed, even though he was, at that time, the top miniature poodle in the country. He was a young dog, but this was "his" year, he had finally put on the coat that was then almost de rigeur for poodles in those days, having already won four BIS at all breed shows the year before, when he gained his championships in both America and Canada. We were very thrilled and delighted to win the variety over the Winners Dog. The toy winners was the white Am. Ch. Silhou-Jette's Snow Sprite, and the Standard was the black, Am. Ch. Prankster Darius. And Gus took the show! It was a grand win, under a great judge to be, for Anne Hone Rogers is now well known at Anne Rogers Clark, and one we will never forget! Poodhall Gus went on to go BIS at the Canadian National Sportsman's show held later in the week on his way to becoming Canada's top winning Miniature poodle for six years in a row, and more than likely the top nonsporting dog, and possibly top dog...but then statistics were not kept, and so we will never know. He retired after winning his 100th Group First (and 28 BIS), this at a time when there were not nearly as many shows as there are now

...for we NEVER exhibited on Sunday in Ontario, since the "Blue Laws" prohibited having any

"fun" on The Lord's Day!

Poodle History notes:

In the fall of 1954, that's 49 years ago. Miss Bay Meyers, Paragon Poodles, decided to organize a poodle booster show in conjunction with the Oakville and District Kennel Club. Poodles were beginning to be seen at shows and here was a chance to promote our poodles although there was no serious thought of forming a club yet. The judge was Joseph Faigel from Detroit. In those days the shows were benched for at least 7 hours and we had fun decorating our benches. The entries consisted of two toys, both white if I remember correctly. 20 miniatures , blacks, silvers and whites and 6 standards , all whites. Below is the CKC print out of the entries and wins. You may recognize a few names of dogs and owners. BB Toys was Bermyth Petite Princess: BB Miniatures, CH Somerset Solomon. BB Standards, Pavanne Domino Capistrano.

On a personal note my first standard was Winners Bitch and Best Opposite Sex and I won an engraved pewter beer mug plus \$20 cash . I am all of 17 years old and thrilled. Later concerned poodle exhibitors came around and collected all the cash back as Miss Meyers had paid several hundred dollars out of her own money to supply all the beautiful trophies and cash awards. I still have that mug!

Enjoy this tidbit of Canadian poodle history.


Len Hartfield's first champion:




